Free State Project members sign a pledge to move to New Hampshire and work to change the way of life in our state. They do not move here for a job, or for family, or even because they like what New Hampshire has to offer. Instead, they move here because a political group they are affiliated with voted on a state to move to in order to enact a political agenda, and New Hampshire was the unlucky recipient of that vote.

Aldrich and his wife signed the early mover pledge, which was aimed at getting 1,000 Free Staters to move to New Hampshire early to establish a network for other Free Staters to follow in later years. The majority of FSP participants will not move until 20,000 individuals have signed on for the Free State Project.

Since moving, Aldrich has established the Lakes Region Porcupines and participated in other activities to grow the Free State Project movement. He is now running for state elected office.

I am from NJ I signed up when the free state project started in 2001 and then signed the early mover pledge called the first 1000, I made the move April 2010 and have not regretted the move even a little bit, I have made many friends and we have made some great strides in making liberty in our lifetime a reality.
